**Living in God's Will-Step 7 Word**

One of the numerous examples, where cycles of “living in Gods will”, are found in the first chapter of Acts. Today we are focusing on the last “step 7”. (see our website for the first 6 steps)

Visualize if you will a circle with 6 points equally distributed on the arc. We have started at the top of the circle with the “Word” of God. We then move to the right to “Worship” once we have discovered He is God and we are not. “Prayer” comes next on the arc where we are listening for the holy Ghost to give us direction on what to pray for. We are then receive “Inspiration” or speak “Prophesy” as we discover it in the Word which is positioned on the bottom of the arc. We then act or put into “Practice” what we have been inspired to do. After we have the experience of action we “Praise” God for the results. In order to complete the cycle we are driven back to the “Word” to begin the process all over again eagerly anticipating what God will next reveal to us. This prompts more awe of His creation culminating in Worship followed by Prayer, Prophesy, Practice, Praise and back to the “Word” again.

As you see the order of this cycle is important. If we start with my word instead of God's we have trouble. If we try to Worship before we know and acknowledge God as Creator or try to tell God in prayer what we need before we listen....well you see the difficulty.

In the beginning was the “Word” and the Word was with God and the Word was God. Christ is the “Word” and the Word is “Christ”. This is why no matter how many times we read and re-read the Word we keep learning and experiencing the amazing depth of God and its ability to speak to us wherever or whatever situation we find ourselves.

We can get stuck at a particular position. Let’s say we get stuck in “Praise” because it feels so good. What happens is we don't move on to what else God has for us and stagnate in our progress of growing to become all that God intends for us. Worship is another place we can get stuck as if there is nothing else. Just like an engine that does not keep moving, it rusts and is kept from reaching destinations it was designed to take us to, so too the Spiritual Cycle when the movement ceases.

The cycle can also be used to identify where we are stuck and what sin we struggle with. We all have sin and if we can identify where we are stuck we can shore up where we are weak.
